Immersed in the Christmas festivities, **Nursery** were rolling, stamping and cutting out tiles of clay. They carefully chose the colours and painted them with rolls.














A genuine diversity of objects were designed by our **Year 2** nurture group, as they came to the art room to develop their own ideas in clay.




