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Impact	
1.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • New link with Highgate School established. Swimming coaches for a very high quality as are the facilities. Children are making a huge amount of progress and the partnership will carry on into next year. Additional boosters have not been possible due to restrictions on pool timings, but will be something that we will do next year. • Review of the playground conducted and more equipment introduced. Table tennis tables have been particularly popular especially with children who may not be so interested in football and basketball. Sports Coach has worked closely with SMSAs and has run sessions on games they can play in the playground. Introducing a skipping area at lunchtime has been popular. • Identified children with low fitness levels and curriculum has been broadened to give them more variety in PE lessons. Intra-school competitions in particular, above and beyond class curriculum, has had a positive effect as has the increase in playground equipment. Through discussions, children generally have a positive attitude towards PE. More targeted groups will be an aim for next year.
