YINKA'S CHALLENGE

The art room had the privilege to work with the five participants of the Craft School Challenge. We found out about the multidisciplinary artist Yinka Ilori and explored different ways to create patterns.

Led by India, head of Design and Technology, the challenge has been set by Crafts Council trustee and multidisciplinary artist Yinka Ilori. It is a nationwide competition to get primary and secondary school students to submit a craft project on one of three themes: play, storytelling, and empowerment.
