	confident he will keep the process tight.

Clerks Note: JCW returned to the meeting

SP proposed JCW as a Co-opted Governor, seconded by JB and governors voted unanimously in favour of JCW becoming a Co-opted Governor.

SP noted that intention would be for JCW to take over as Chair in September.

SP informed governors of LC's decision to step down as a Co-opted Governor. She felt she could no longer give the time needed to fulfil the role and had tendered her resignation. SP accepted her resignation and thanked her for her work and commitment to the school.

LA term of office as Parent Governor expires on 23.03.23. SP proposed that she is Coopted. LM seconded the proposal and the FGB voted unanimously in LA being co-opted.

SP shared a proposed new governor structure outlining the changes to the board and the potential vacancies. Noted that JB's and YB's term of office expires on 01.07.23.

Headteacher's Report - Shared with FGB via Governor Hub ahead of the meeting.

- Currently 406 on roll, more spaces in the younger year groups, 14 spaces.
 - Capital works has mostly been completed, children now have full use of the playground and the scaffolding has been removed.
 - Many snagging items still to be completed
 - Marva Rollins has almost completed all Subject Leader interviews
 - Rob Burgess will present spring term data to Curriculum Committee next week
 - School Partnership review in early reading was completed by leaders at Cold Fall and St Michaels – they submitted the report ahead of the Ofsted and it was very positive. BL and WD to visit other schools as part of this programme.
 - Maths is continuing to be strong with Rob and Tom having a visit from the Maths Hub lead to focus on early years. White Rose is being well implemented.
 - PPG and Catch up programmers. Continuing to actively target PPG children to attend extended provision.

- One child has secured a place at The Grove Special school, this will reduce some pressure in reception. Feel that two more should definitely be in
- Currently 19 children with EHCP's with a new starter in Yr5 who also has one. Not all children with EHCP's require 1:1 support, regularly assess their needs.

Q) Does the school feel that the high numbers of SEN are putting parents off from sending their children to the school or contributing to why people leave? A) No don't feel that this is an issue or that children are leaving due to the SEN numbers.

- Working with Highgate Learning Partnership. Several Yr6 are being referred for support with transition. Those who are possibly at risk of exclusion in secondary school. HLP are being very supportive.
- Emma SENCo is working well and is attending lots of trainings
- Schools pastoral/therapeutic services were positively commented on in the Ofsted parent and pupil surveys.
- Michael Ingell-Clerk continues his pastoral support and these are well attended. Further developing Yr 6 playground buddy imitative
- Concern that mental health and anxiety issues are increasing. Two referrals to CAHMS have been made for more extreme cases.

Q) Is there any year group that is particularly anxious?

A) More so in Yr5 and Yr4 has some quite specific children.

- Attendance continues to improve. Now signed up to the EWS and the EWO sends out letters to parents and supports us with persistent absenteeism
- New PSA team are excellent, lots of new events and initiatives.
- Night Owls is well attended, Ellie is to leave at Easter and Sam will take over who
 is also very capable.
- Harnigey Families are to re-start a Toddler group and the baby-weighing clinic has already returned.
- Mayor's office confirmed free school meals for all London primary school children starting from September.

Governors suggested parents could be asked to donate what they would have spent on school meals.

 Climate change consultant completed a detailed report looking at the issue of sustainability in regards to the school site. Most items relate to energy and water.
