Nursery

Reception

Year I



Year I put into practice all they have been learning about their five senses as they went on a Bear Hunt. It was indeed a beautiful day and they weren't at all scared as they made their way through swishy-swashy, long, wavy grass; traversed a deep, cold splashy-sploshy river; got stuck in thick, oozy squelchy-squerchy mud, stumbled through a dark, gloomy forest and were caught in a swirling whirling hooo-wooo snowstorm. Finally, they tiptoed into a long, dark, gloomy cave to find... A BEAR!

When not bear hunting, the children have been enjoying the Eric Carle books 'Polar Bear, Polar Bear, what do you See?' and 'Brown Bear, Brown Bear, what do you Hear?' They loved their

visit from Elif and Khloe in Blanche Nevile who talked about hearing aids and cochlear implants and demonstrated their expertise in British Sign Language. The children have also been fascinated by the story of Louis Braille who invented the Braille alphabet at the age of 15. They carefully studied the patterns of dots to write their own names in Braille. What an exciting start to Year I – and we still have Smell and Taste to come!

Year 2



Year 2 has had a great start to the year. The children have already met so many animals including a real live crocodile when 'Safari Pete' came to visit. They've been writing all about 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' and have been learning about habitats and food chains in science. They even made it to the zoo. Being an adventurous lot, both classes went for a day trip to London Zoo -travelling on the London Underground for a wonderful time spotting lions and tigers, and marveling at the giraffes and penguins. Year 2 are most definitely now animal experts.


Year 3



The Year 3 children have been honing their historical and scientific skills this month in our fantastic topic 'From Palaeontology to Archaeology'. First, as Palaeontologists, they explored the playground and searched for the remains of dinosaurs. Then as Geologists, they observed and compared the properties of sedimentary, igneous and metamorphic rocks. These two sciences came together rather neatly as they learned the remarkable story of the pioneer Mary Anning and her fantastic fossil discoveries. The Year 3s have also been enjoying their computing lessons. Recently they were challenged to complete the task of: 'Avoid the Dinosaur', where they had to program floor robots to navigate a

course and avoid colliding with the dinosaurs, which were placed as obstacles on the course.

Year 4



Year 4 children have loved their introduction to the year and all things ancient Greek within their topic 'Masks and Minotaurs'. With great enthusiasm, they have studied and reenacted myths such as *Theseus and the Mintoaur* and *Perseus and the Gorgon Medusa*. They can locate Greece and describe its geography in great detail. The children have also honed their skills as young historians on their recent visit to the British Museum. Here they closely observed artefacts, including amphorae, after first designing and drawing their own, which now impressively adorn the classroom displays.

Year 5



The children in Year 5 have embraced life as Victorian school children with aplomb. They have visited a ragged school, performed two outstanding assemblies, learnt what it was like to

live in the workhouse and will soon be experts at Victorian playground games. We can't wait for Victorian Day.

Year 6



Year 6 have hugely enjoyed exploring their topic on mountains - writing metaphor filled poetry, crafting adventure stories full of terrifying near-misses, and writing detailed biographies of Tenzing Norgay, one of the first mountaineers to conquer Everest. Here are our wonderful mountain pastels, and a great example of the landscapes we made in the art studio with Andrea.
